

Legislation to improve fire safety in non-domestic premises in Scotland is now in force. Part 3 of the Fire (Scotland) Act requires anyone who manages, operates or has safety obligations for non-domestic premises to take steps to prevent and minimise the impact of fire. This includes owners, employers, employees, managers and other occupiers. Similar legislation is in place within other parts of the United Kingdom.

Fire certificates are abolished under the new system – with existing certificates becoming invalid. Instead, the new fire safety regime will be based on the principles of risk assessment and the requirement to both prevent fire and reduce its detrimental effects, to protect human life.
